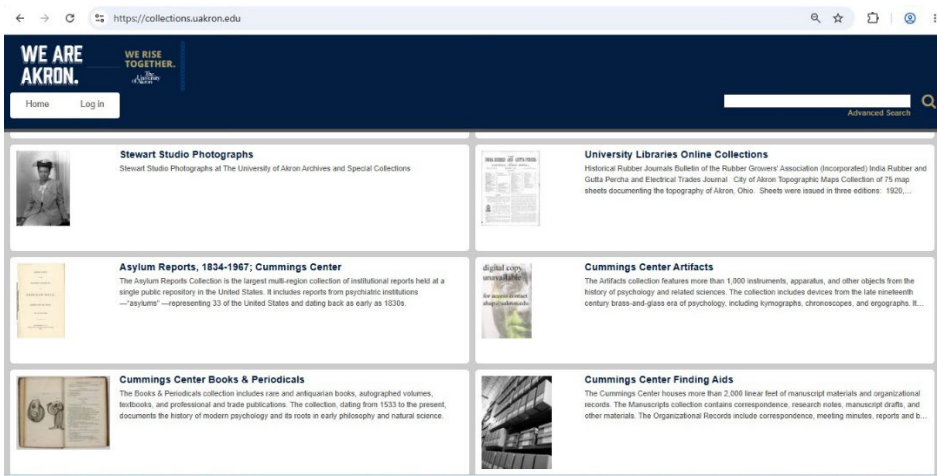

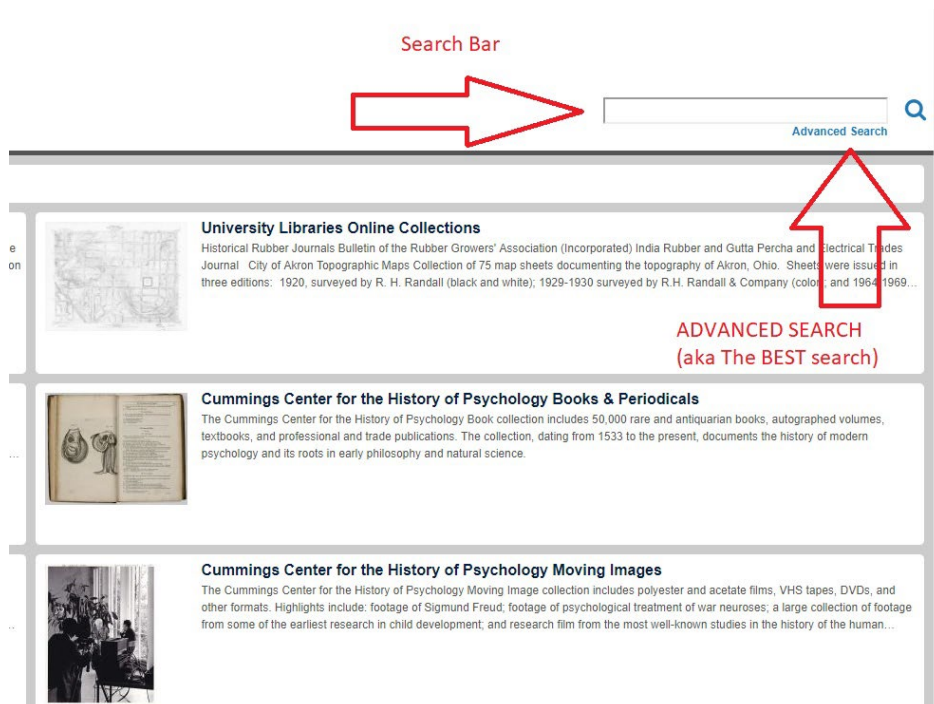
All of the Cummings Center collections are represented with varying amounts of descriptive metadata in our online repository. This is the best place to start when you're considering research at the Cummings Center.

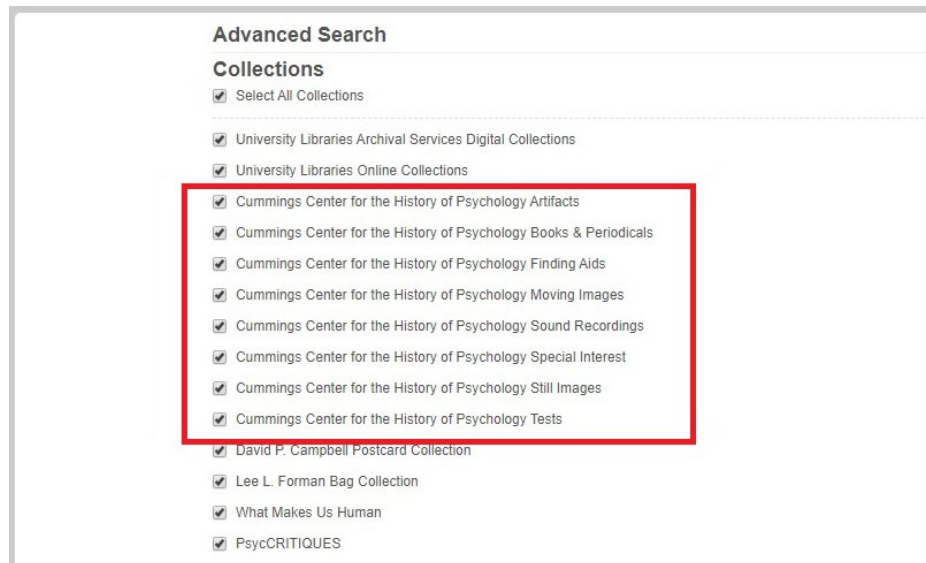


The platform we use for our repository is shared by several other units at The University of Akron, so look for collections that include “Cummings Center” in the name.

In order to search across all collections you'll need to do an Advanced Search.



After clicking Advanced Search, you will see a list of every University of Akron collection included in the online repository. All of these collections are selected (or “checked”) by default. To search **only** the Cummings Center for the History of Psychology collections, deselect every collection that does not contain “Cummings Center.”

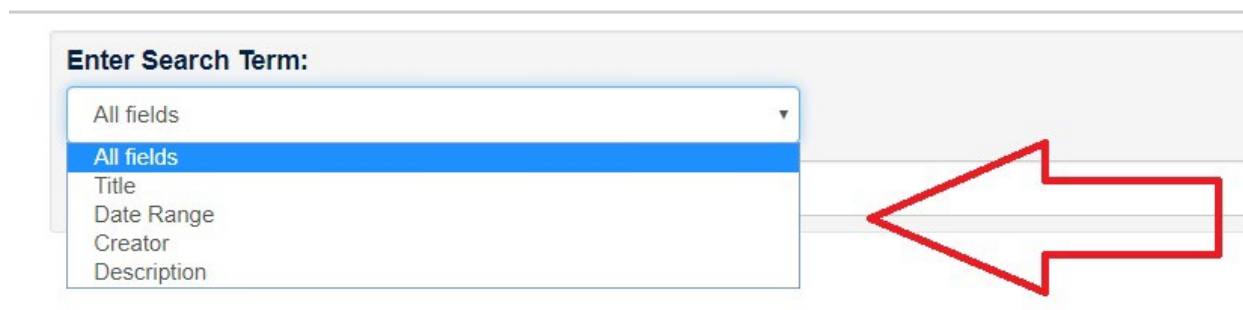

You can now search for your keyword(s) across the Cummings Center collections and locate relevant materials in a variety of formats.

Note: The archival manuscript collections and the records of psychological organizations are represented in the Finding Aids collection. If you are **only** interested in archival papers, then **only** select “Cummings Center for the History of Psychology Finding Aids.”

Once you have selected your desired collections, click the “Save” button. Then, at the bottom of the page, you can narrow your search using search terms.

As an example, let’s select only “Finding Aids” and search for Anne Anastasi. If you search across “All Fields” for Anastasi, you will see **every instance** of her name in any manuscript collection. Or, if you’re interested only in personal papers **belonging to** Anastasi, you can search for her name in the “Title” field exclusively.



Enter Search Term:

Searching across all the manuscript collections for “Anastasi” bring back 17 hits, including Anastasi’s personal papers and all other collection that include her name in the Finding Aid.

All the collections pop up alphabetically on the right and you can scroll through them. And on the left, you can see the titles and creators of collections.
